Christopher Wainwright



Christopher has a rich and diverse background in the arts, combining professional experience in arts management, arts journalism, and music criticism with a distinguished career as a senior public servant in the Commonwealth Government.

Outside his professional role, Christopher is an accomplished pianist and pipe organist. Since 2005, he has served as organist at St Oswald's Anglican Church, Parkside, following his earlier tenure as organ scholar at St George the Martyr Anglican Church, Goodwood.

Christopher's formal music education began at the Adelaide Institute of TAFE's Flinders Street School of Music, where he completed an Advanced Diploma in Music (Performance), majoring in piano under the guidance of Dr Diana Weekes. During his Advanced Diploma studies, he studied harpsichord with Glenys March and Lesley Lewis.

He later transferred to the University of Adelaide's Elder Conservatorium of Music, earning a first-class honours degree in musicology while continuing harpsichord studies. During this time, Christopher also commenced private pipe organ tuition with Christa Rumsey.
